***The LWML Teams up with Lutheran Hour Ministries
In expanding Gospel outreach to Hispanics in the United States***

The mission of Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) is bringing Christ to the Nations — and the Nations to the Church.



Lutheran Hour Ministries has a great opportunity to expand its Gospel outreach to Hispanics (the second largest ethnic group in the United States), with Christian resources, printed materials, media and outreach technology in the Spanish language in ways that are applicable to daily life. The Good News of salvation will be shared by working with LCMS (Lutheran Church Missouri Synod) ministry leaders, churches, districts, universities, and seminaries to encourage outreach to Hispanics.



This \$100,000 LWML mission grant, along with LHM's work, will let our Hispanic brothers and sisters hear the Gospel message in Spanish through a powerful Christian witness of love that will strengthen and encourage them to faith in Jesus Christ.

These enhanced resources should be a benefit for the Spanish speaking population here in our own Quad Cities, and our East Moline LCMS *Christ the King (Cristo Rey) Lutheran Church*, pastored by the Rev. Pablo Dominguez .

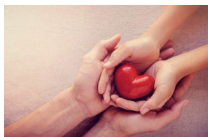

BUDDY BAGS

When children go into foster care they are removed from a home that has been deemed a risk. They often leave the home with no belongings. A blanket or stuffed animal can provide comfort for a child going to an unfamiliar home. It is something they can call their own. These children also often do not have the basic necessities such as a toothbrush, comb or basic hygiene items. Babies often have few or no diapers. A buddy Bag can help assist a child transition to a sometimes unfamiliar living arrangement.
