CURRENT DFM PROJECT

Water heater for Cristo Rey Lutheran Church, East Moline

Dollar for Missions (DFM) contributions in late 2024 will help to pay for a new water heater at Cristo Rey Lutheran Church, East Moline. The church's previous water heater is almost 20 years old.

"This is another 'non-glamor' item," said CID Mission Executive Ken Schurb. "Yet to proclaim the Gospel in Spanish at Cristo Rey, especially in winter time, a reliable hot water heater is a helpful piece of equipment to have." Plumbing as well as painting and many other such things have their place in a mission.

Cristo Rey is CID's only congregation in which the ministry is conducted almost entirely in Spanish. It serves, particularly, Spanish-speaking people in the Quad Cities.

Pastor Pablo Dominguez has served in East Moline for over 20 years. First he was a CID missionary-at-large, then subsequently pastor of Cristo Rey. The congregation formally joined the Synod in 2018.

Amount to be funded: \$1,000

Project: Replace water heater at Cristo Rey Lutheran Church, East Moline.

Protecting Albino Children -Tanzania Children's Home Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania, Africa



In Tanzania, Africa, albinos (absence of skin pigment) represent one in every 1429 births, a much higher rate than in any other nation. Such children are persecuted because witch doctors promote a belief in the magical and superstitious properties of albinos' body parts. These children are seen as bad omens and treated as unwanted or even have body parts amputated and sold to witch doctors.

Parents of albino children will protect their children by sending them to an orphanage offering them more security. The Ev. Lutheran Church of Tanzania has a training center for Mwadui church leaders. This campus also contains a Lutheran Boarding School.

In 2021, an orphanage was built to provide a home and school for albino children. Since the orphanage is located next to the Lutheran boarding school and training center, the albino children are integrated into a more normal life and are not isolated. There they are cared for, body and soul, and reared knowing Christ's love and His gift of salvation.

The purpose of this \$74,500 mission grant will purchase a bus to transport children from their homes to school and assist with the funding of the children's care. To learn more and see a video on this project, visit
